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01 Safety performance since start-up

02 Management system

Ameristar's HSE management system is certified to ISO 45001 (occupational health and safety) and ISO 14001 (environmental management), alongside ISO 9001 for quality. Every rig, vessel and aircraft operates under the same permit-to-work, journey management and stop-work-authority procedures regardless of district or customer.

03 High-potential near misses

Four high-potential near misses were investigated in the period. Each was closed with a documented corrective action and a company-wide lessons-learned bulletin. No near miss in the period resulted in injury or environmental release. Investigation summaries are available to contracted operators through the client workspace.

04 Environmental performance

- Zero-discharge pad design standard on all onshore locations.
- Closed-loop solids control fleet-wide; no unlined reserve pits.
- Riserless mud recovery and managed pressure drilling available on deepwater and MPD-rated units.
- No reportable environmental releases recorded since start-up.

05 Workforce and training

All field personnel complete a common onboarding and competency programme regardless of which district they are assigned to, including well-control certification renewal on a fixed schedule and an annual stop-work-authority refresher. Training completion is tracked centrally out of the Midland operations centre.

This report is the complete current revision. It is reissued annually and after any recordable incident, whichever occurs first.
